

The ACA has recently conducted state visits to meet with players around the country as it works through the possibility of an MOU negotiation, in anticipation of the potential privatisation of the Big Bash Leagues. The collective playing group have seven key objectives that form the ACA's proposal to Cricket Australia.

1. Players should enjoy their fair share of value they have generated in the W/BBL that in turn delivers increased Player Payments to secure the commitment of our players and the ongoing strength of our competitions and teams
2. Ensure appropriate controls are put in place for any Private Investors in order to protect players and Australian Cricket
3. Drive innovation and modernisation of Australian Cricket's commercial framework for the benefit of players and the game
4. Evolve our model to ensure Australian Cricket continues to be a leader in Gender Equity
5. Deliver an improved Player Development and Wellbeing Support model aligned to Australian Cricket's Player Wellbeing Strategy
6. Introduce a best-in-class Post-Career Injury Support Scheme that is comparative to other major Australian sports
7. Ongoing improvement of players' Workplace and Contractual Conditions

As talks progress, the ACA will continue working closely with the playing group throughout negotiations to ensure the best possible outcome.
